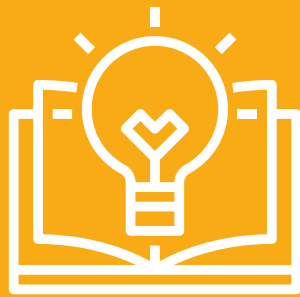
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Focus Areas

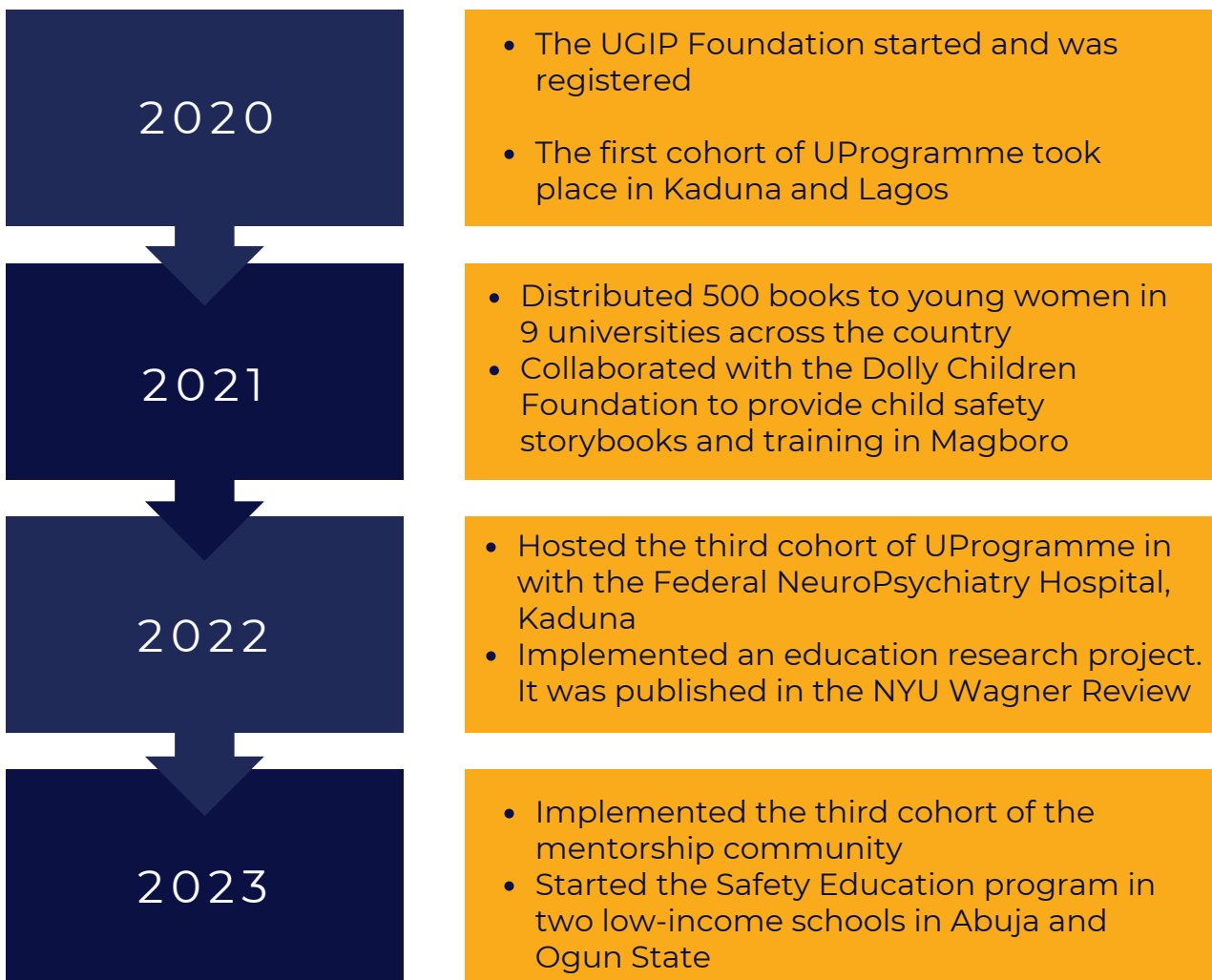

UProgramme



Objectives

- To equip recovering drug users with useful skills for reintegration into society.
- To provide digital skills training to participants.

01. Training Content and Delivery

- Topics covered included Social Media Marketing, Instagram Marketing, Graphics Design, Whiteboard Animation, and Video Editing.
- Classes involved theoretical and practical knowledge application, including hands-on activities and assessments.

02. Outcomes

- Pre- and post-training assessments indicated significant improvement in participants' digital skills.
- Participants demonstrated the ability to create and execute social media campaigns, graphic designs, and whiteboard animations.

03. Challenges

- Limited access to devices for practical assignments.
- Participant numbers reduced due to rehabilitation completions and other internal issues.

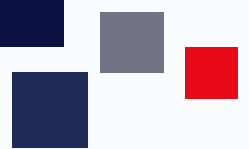
04. Recommendations

- Increase device accessibility for practical sessions.
- Improve communication and engagement strategies to ensure consistent participant attendance.

Education: Train Them Young Initiative (#2TYI) Research Project



Objectives

- To increase children's injury prevention knowledge.
- To empower children to share their new knowledge within their spheres of influence effectively.
- To compare knowledge retention before and after the intervention.

01. Methodology

- Children received a safety guidebook and participated in weekly reading and discussion sessions.
- Pre and post-tests were conducted to measure knowledge improvement.
- Groups were assigned to produce safety presentations

02. Outcomes

- Knowledge levels increased from 58.02% to 76.5%
- Primary 6 pupils performed better than Primary 5 in creative and delivery tasks.
- Group activities included presentations, songs, playlets, and drama.

03. Challenges

- Ineffective communication led to low post-test participation.
- Limited resources restricted the number of beneficiaries.

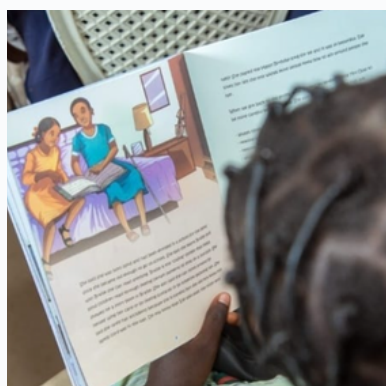
04. Recommendations

- Enhance communication strategies for better turnout.
- Seek additional funding and sponsorship to reach more children and provide adequate resources.



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

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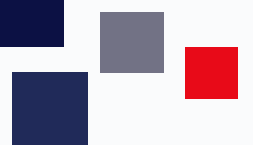

Weekly Wisdom Nuggets

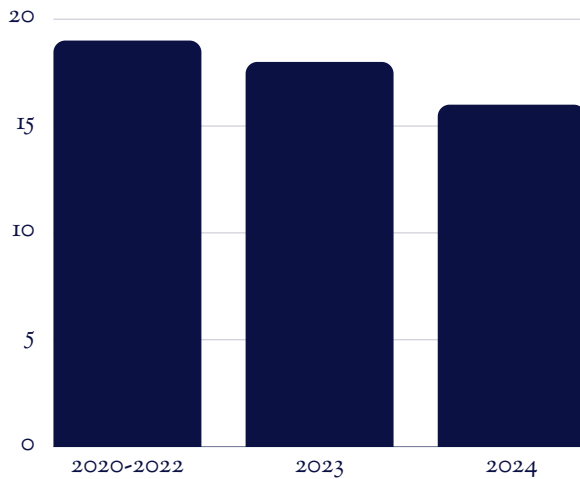
Our founder shares weekly nuggets and members share their growth hacks every third Thursday.



Resource Library

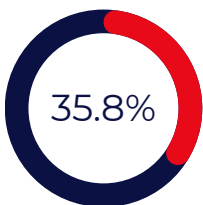
We have a robust library of resources and members learn with videos of the month.

MENTORSHIP Data Report



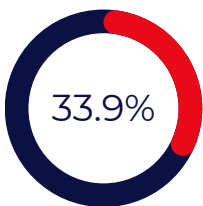
Description

The mentorship program has catered to a total of 53 participants since 2020, with a vibrant alumni community of 37 people, the current cohort will graduate in November 2024.



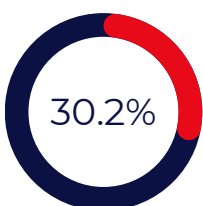
First Cohort

GWT Nation was that push I needed to walk on water and the beautiful thing was that I did not drown.

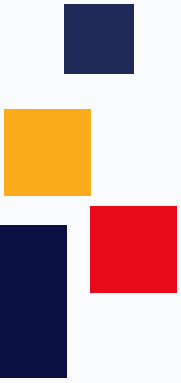

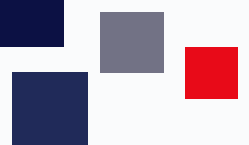
